Identifying & using formal & informal vocabulary

Informal English is also more relaxed about grammar rules than formal English, using simpler grammatical structures and loosely-connected sentences and phrases When used in writing, informal English uses first and second person points-of-view (eg, I, you and we) to create a more personal style than formal English
